The 1988 season had the coldest, wettest, most miserable start in living history *Penny King stated, "I started the year on the Board of Directors as a single female surrounded by 14 men (12 elected and 2 staff). Things improved somewhat when Lillian Swanburg was appointed to complete a term. Come November I'll be all alone unless some other ladies are elected.
